## FREDERICTON TAKES TITLE

Wins From St. Peters, 7 to 3, and League Season Ends.

By defeating St. Peter's by a score of 7 to 3 on Saturday the Fredericton baseball team clinched the title of the Two I League and incidentally the right to play-off with St. Stephen for the championship of the province. The local team presented a more or less crippled line-up, Dever and Mooney playing with injured hands, and their support behind Price, who pitched well was erratic, a total of seven errors being made. On the other hand Fredericton had only one error and gave McCourt good support. The Capital team secured thirteen hits, while the locals netted twelve. On numerous occasions the locals started rallies but hits were not forthcoming when needed and chance after chance was lost. 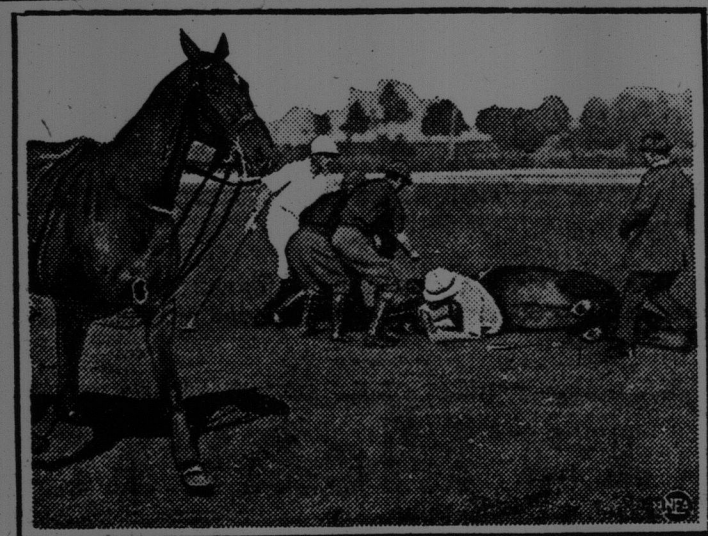
