

FOREST FIRES IN PROVINCE AGAIN

Heat Makes Situation Serious Again and Utmost Care is Necessary.

(Special to Times) Fredericton, N. B., July 17.—The first reports of forest fires received by the department of lands and mines since June 8, came this morning—one fire on Cain's River, south of Doaktown, and another at Coal Branch, Kent county. Details are lacking.

The outlook in the observation towers in various parts of the country, who were removed when rains made fires most unlikely, are now being replaced as the extreme heat in the central portion of the province is drying the country up rapidly and there is increasing danger.

Fishing parties and other parties in the woods for recreations are warned particularly to be careful. The province of Quebec adopted the "travel permit" regulation on June 12, requiring all persons passing through forest lands to have such permits.

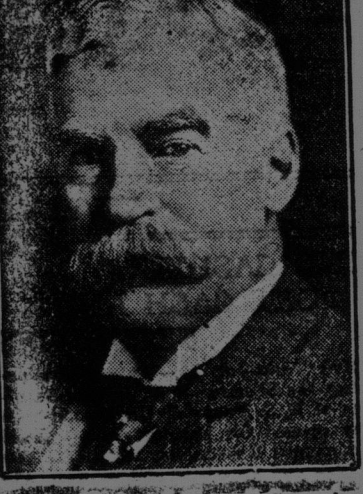

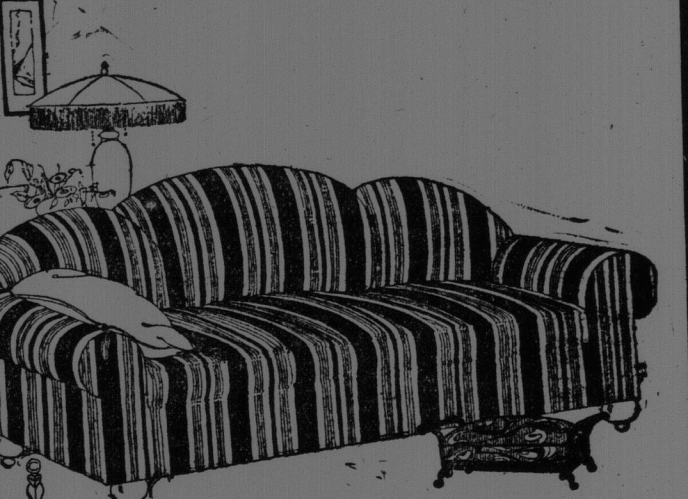
