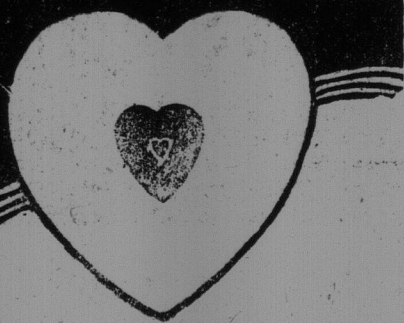

WILLARD GETS SUM OF \$200,000
Richard Guarantees \$100,000 and "Movie" Firm Will Pay Similar Amount

New York, March 22.—At an informal conference here tonight the managers of Jess Willard and Jack Dempsey discussed the heavyweight championship contest, scheduled for July 4, with promoter Tex Rickard preparatory to arranging for preliminary training. Willard was represented by Ray Archer, while Dempsey's plans were explained by Jack Kearns.

Both managers stated that they were in this city prepared to engage sparring partners for their principals, and each carried a list of heavyweight boxers from which it was expected they would be selected.
According to the champion's manager, Willard has already begun light physical work and is a trifle below 270 pounds in weight. He is particularly desirous of getting sparring partners of about the height and weight of Dempsey, and in order to be acceptable they must be fast, hard-hitting, two-handed punchers.
The champion will do all of his work at his home in Lawrence until six weeks before the bout, when, according to the terms of his contract with Rickard, he will move to the scene of the titular battle. In the interim, however, Willard will find time to star in a moving picture drama in which he will appear as the hero. He will be filmed during his actual training work, will take part in a ring battle and presumably will at some stage of the picture rescue the beautiful heroine from impending danger. Willard's stipend for submitting himself to

the camera will be \$100,000, it is reported.
Dempsey expects to leave for Palm Beach tomorrow for a week or ten days of rest before engaging in an athletic vaudeville tour of a month. Dempsey weighs 197 pounds at present, and will enter the ring at between 192 and 196 pounds.
He will begin serious training May 1 and will have as sparring partners the largest and heaviest men who can be engaged, in order that he may be accustomed to boxing men as near as possible the physical standard of Willard.

WILLARD NOW SEEKS SPARRING PARTNERS
Champion is Down to 268 and Will be in Fine Condition for Bout, Says His Secretary

New York, March 22.—Jess Willard, world's heavyweight champion, is confident of retaining his laurels in his bout with Jack Dempsey, July 4. The Kansas is convinced of his own invincibility, at least as far as Dempsey is concerned. Ray Archer, secretary to Willard, made his declaration yesterday when he arrived here from Chicago. Archer added that Willard is prepared to wager his own end of the purse and an additional \$10,000 that Dempsey will not succeed in gaining the title. Willard's bet, if it is made, will involve \$10,000 of the champion's resources.
Archer is visiting the city primarily for the purpose of securing sparring partners for the title-holder and to discuss further with promoter Tex Rickard the details of the bout. Rickard leaves this afternoon for Texas.
According to Archer, Willard will surprise ring followers with his condition on the day of the bout. The champion, it is said, has planned a course of rigorous training which will bring him as near the shape he enjoyed when he won the title as it is possible to be, considering the easy and inactive life Willard has been living.
The champion, Archer said, weighs 268 pounds now, despite reports to the contrary. Willard has been popularly supposed to have weighed nearer to 300 pounds. Willard will take up serious
