FALLS DOWN STAIRS; KILLED

A Proquest letter to the Bangor Commercial says: "Mrs. Mary Kierstead met a tragic death on Friday evening at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Henry Lamoreaux, Mayville. Mrs. Kierstead had started to go from one room to another when, by mistake, she opened the collar door and pitched to the bottom of the stairs, striking against the wall. Her skull was fractured and she did not regain consciousness to any extent before her death early on Saturday. She was the widow of Stephen Kierstead and was born in New Brunswick in June, 1838. THE EARLY CLOSING LAW

A question having been raised as to what shops may keep open if early closing is adopted, the sections of the by-law relating thereto is here given:—

(a) "Shop" shall mean any building or portion of a building, stall, stall, or place where goods are exposed or offered for sale by retail; but not where the only trade or business carried on is that of a druggist, tobacconist, news agent, hotel, inn, tavern, restaurant, cafe, fruitier, confectioner, keeper of an ice cream parlor, or vendor of soda water, where no groceries are sold or kept for sale; nor any grocery store nor home delivery shop the owner of which conducts the business alone without help, nor any business where the sale of liquor is a part of the business.

(b) "Closed" shall mean not open for service of any customer, provided that no shop shall be deemed to be closed if it is open for the sale of goods, or the serving of any customers during their continuance therein.

ASQUITH'S SOUVENIR

Premier Preserves as Curiosity

Suffragette Hatchet Throws at Him

London, Sept. 10.—An interesting addition has been made to the collection of historical relics at No. 10 Downing street, the London official residence of the British prime minister. This is the hatchet which was thrown by a suffragette at Premier Asquith during his visit to Dublin. Mrs. Asquith specially asked that this hatchet should be given to her as a memento of the event, but the Dublin police could not grant her request, so a formal request for it had been made to the Dublin authorities by the secretary for home affairs.

The hatchet was thrown by a woman who is now undergoing five years' imprisonment. It narrowly escaped Mr. Asquith, who was leaning forward at the time. It struck John E. Redmond on the head, and but for the fact that he was wearing a silk hat of the heavy old-fashioned type, it might have killed him. As it was, he sustained a wound from the effects of which he is still suffering.

DETECTIVE CARPENTER NEW EDMONTON POLICE CHIEF

Edmonton, Alta., Sept. 10.—Sime H. Carpenter, for seventeen years chief of detectives of Montreal, who will succeed J. C. Lacey, resigned, as chief of the police department of Edmonton on September 25, has an international reputation as a "thief-taker." He was brought into world-wide prominence in 1903, in connection with the arrest of Gagner and the capture of the central figures with Captain Carter in the federal building graft cases at Savannah, Ga., landing them after an exciting chase in a tug boat up the St. Lawrence river.

The prisoners spent fortunes in fighting extradition, but were finally delivered to the United States authorities.

Carpenter also handled numerous important cases in eastern Canada, the United States and Cuba. He is president of the "Chief Constables' Association of Canada, to which office he was elected by unanimous vote at the convention in Brantford, Ont.

SPAIN'S KING SAYS TOO MUCH

MOTHER-IN-LAW

Alonso and Princess Henry

Do Not Get Along Well Together

VICTORIA AS PEACEMAKER

Queen Does Not Succeed, However—Climax of a Long Series of Quarrels Between Monarch and Autocratic Mother of His Wife

(Times Special Correspondence.)

London, Aug. 29.—King Alfonso of Spain is troubled with much mother-in-law. He and Princess Henry of Battenberg do not hit it off at all well and at last have agreed to disagree. All the efforts of Queen Victoria, King Alfonso's English wife, to reconcile the two have been in vain.

The final break came on the occasion of the recent visit of the King and Queen of Spain to Osborne Cottage, the life of which, home of Princess Henry, for Coves week. The king and his mother-in-law have quarrelled before—in fact, they have agreed over few things since the king first came avoiding the daughter of the house of Battenberg. But the last spat between the hot-blooded Spanish monarch and the autocratic daughter of Queen Victoria was the temperamental differences of the king and the Spanish court. The low and devotion of her husband's subjects are as breath to her nostrils and she has striven heart to the very way into their hearts.

Now, Princess Henry has frequently remonstrated with King Alfonso about his way of the king and the dandy. She sympathizes with the latter, but loves the former. Many a woman in more humble walks of life has been torn between the same alternatives.

Over Many Matters

King Alfonso and his mother-in-law fight over a great variety of subjects. In the early days of his married life he was constantly being called to account because of his reported fondness for French actresses and in the course of the most recent kicking Princess Henry showed that she had the most intimate details of her son-in-law's friendship with a popular favorite of the Parisian stage. Of course all Paris has been talking and gossiping about the affair for weeks and many of the facts are public property, but the king's mother-in-law is not a person to let such matters pass.

Now King Alfonso is not a bad man as things go. Despite his lack of facial beauty—he was not called a "monkey" by Princess Patricia of Connaught, whom he wooed to his side—he is extremely vain. He is human enough to pride himself on his powers as a heart-breaker.
