SECOND WITNESS FOR PROSECUTION (cont'd)

start guard on every shift.

Q. 29 Can you tell the Court how many men there are in "A" Guard?

- A. 29 I don't know, Sir.
- Q. 30 Can you tell the Court if there were any others absent at that time?
- A. 30 I can't remember, Sir.
- Q. 31 Would it be possible for the accused to have been there and not answer to his name?
- A. 31 He was not there, I know him by sight.

The Prosecutor declines to re-examine the witness.

In the opinion of the Court, it is not necessary to comply with R.P. 83 (B).

The witness withdraws.

THIRD WITNESS FOR PROSECUTION.

- Q. 37 Have you the original of this document?
- A. 37 No, Sir.
- Q. 38 Where is the original of this document?
- A. 38 The original copy was sent to Headquarters.
