FOR PROSECUTION (cont'd)

start guard on every shift.

Q. 29 Can you tell the Court how many men there are in "A" Guard?

A. 29 I don't know, Sir.

Q. 30 Can you tell the Court if there were any others absent at that time?

A. 30 I can't remember, Sir.

Q. 31 Would it be possible for the accused to have been there and not answer to his name?

A. 31 He was not there, I know him by sight.

The Prosecutor declines to re-examine the witness.

In the opinion of the Court, it is not necessary to comply with R.P. 83 (B).

The witness withdraws.

THIRD WITNESS
FOR PROSECUTION.

Lieut. (A/Captain) G.L. Tisdale, R.C.O.C., C.A., Longue Pointe Ordnance Depot, C.A., being duly sworn, is examined by the Prosecutor.

Q. 32 Will you give your name, christian name and describe your functions in the Army?

A. 32 I am Captain George L. Tisdale, R.C.O.C., Longue Pointe Ordnance Depot.

Q. 33 Do you know the accused?

A. 33 Yes, Sir.

Q. 34 What is his name?

A. 34 Private GORE.

Q. 35 Do you know his initial?

A. 35 I think it's "W".

Q. 36 Have you any documents to produce to the Court in connection with the charges laid against the accused?

A. 36 I wish to present to the Court a certified true copy of the M.F.C. 800?

Q. 37 Have you the original of this document?

A. 37 No, Sir.

Q. 38 Where is the original of this document?

A. 38 The original copy was sent to Headquarters.
