He was granted a new trial at the assizes this morning, the jury being emphatically from among spectators in the court room. Herbert changed his plea to "not guilty." The crown stated that it had no evidence to offer and Judge Meredith directed the jury to bring in a verdict of acquittal. This was done and the prisoner was allowed to leave the court room.
