make good thrifty pigs without milk and can raise fairly good pigs with corn as the main food. Next to milk, water is the most important thing a pig needs. Make a fairly good and palatable slop from these, and push a rapid growth. The first thing to be done is to get the pigs to eating before they are weaned so that their growth will not be checked. In the first three months of life the months old the growth of frame should be pushed as much as possible, but do not attempt to fatten them, and for this reason the less corn they eat the better. At four months old begin to feed corn, and gradually increase the amount until you may find that all they will eat but you will get growth as well as fatness and more lean meat if you keep up the bran-slop until they are ready for market. I believe in feeding three times a day so that they will eat clean, and so that they will always have some water to drink. For the next meal, rather than a spoon
