

STENSON, MICHAEL THOMAS (*Richmond and Wolfe*).

S. of the late John Stenson, grain dealer in the town of Kildare, Irel., who came to Can. in 1840, and carried on business in Montreal as a wood merchant. B. in the parish of Longford, Co. of Meath, Irel., 18 Dec., 1838. Ed. at St. Mary's Coll., Bleury St., Montreal, and afterwards in Agriculture at Ste. Anne de la Pocatiere. M., 1st, in 1860, Bridget G. O'Reilly (she d.); 2nd, in 1886, Marie-Rosalie Deseve, of Sherbrooke. Carried on farming at Cote St. Michel, near Montreal, until 1862, when he removed to Tp. of Wotton, Co. of Wolfe. Taught school there for three years, and was Inspector of Schools for the dist. of St. Francis, from 1864 to June, 1896. Was for several years Mayor of Wotton, and Warden of the Co. of Wolfe. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1896. A Liberal.—*Wotton, P.Q.*

STUBBS, WILLIAM (*Carlwell*).

Parents were natives of the Co. Fermanagh, Irel., and came to Can. in 1824, and settled in the Tp. of Caledon. B. in that Tp., 11 July, 1847. Ed. in the Public School and at the Veterinary School of Medicine, Toronto. M., 1888, Annie, dau. of the late William Gillespie of Orangeville. Is a veterinary surgeon. Has been first Deputy Reeve and Reeve of the Tp. of Caledon. First returned to Parlt. at by-election held 24 Dec., 1895, and re-elected at g. e., 1896. An Independent Conservative.—*Caledon, P.O.*

SUTHERLAND, JAMES (*North Oxford*).

S. of the late Alexander Sutherland, who came to Canada in 1841, from Caithness-shire, Scot., settled in the Tp. of Ancaster, Co. of Wentworth, afterwards moved to the Tp. of East Zorra, Co. of Oxford, in 1855, by his wife, Allison, dau. of the late John Renton, of Ancaster. B. 17 July, 1849, in the Tp. of Ancaster, Co. of Wentworth. Ed. at the Grammar School, Woodstock. Unmarried. Was a mem. of the Municipal Council of Woodstock for several years; was Reeve from 1877 to 1879, and Mayor for 1880. Has been a mem. of the Collegiate Institute Board of Trustees, since 1880. First returned to Parlt., 9 Dec., 1880, on death of the sitting mem. Re-elected at g. e.,
