BAILEY, Lt.-Col. GIDEON DORE, J.P. [*Queens.*]

Of English parentage. B. in Sunbury, N. B., 25 Feb., 1819. M., Feb., 1848, Miss Branscombe. Lt.-Col. Queens Militia, and Presdt. of Agricultural Society. Sat for present seat in N. B. Assembly from 1865 to 1866. Returned again at last g. e.—*Newcastle Creek, N. B.*

BECKWITH, Hon. JOHN A. [*York.*]

Descended paternally from the family of Beckwith, of Norwich, Eng., and maternally from C. de Brun de Du Plessis, cousin and private sec'y. to the Cardinal De Richelieu. B. at Fredericton, N. B., 1 Dec., 1800. Ed. there, and at Toronto, Montreal, and Windsor, N. S. M., 1st, Miss Ann L. Jonett (dead); 2ndly Miss Marie A. Bouton, both of Fredericton. Has been Mayor of Fredericton. Was Deputy Comr. and Surveyor-genl., N. B. Is Chairman Provincial Board of Agriculture, Major 1st Batt. York Co. Militia, and director of Quebec and N. B. Railway. Apptd. mem. of the Ex. Council, and Provincial Secy.
