An Act to amend the Law relating to petty trespasses in Upper Canada.

IN amendment of the Law relating to petty trespasses in Upper Canada, Preamble. Her Majesty, &c., enacts as follows :---

I. No person shall enter into, come upon, or pass through, or turn any No person to enter, or to Horses, Cattle, Sheep or Swine upon, or permit any such to go or range allow his cattle. 5 at large upon, or in any way trespass upon any land or premises whatsoever, the land of whether wholly or in part inclosed, being the property of any other person permission. without the permission of such proprietor, or of some person by him duly authorized to grant such permission, under a penalty of not less than nor more than

- 10 for every such offence, irrespective of any damage having or not having been occasioned thereby; and such penalty may be recovered, with costs in every case of conviction, before any one Justice of the Peace, who shall decide the matter in a summary way, and award costs in case of conviction which may be had either on view, or on confession of the party complained
- 15 against, or on the oath of one credible witness.

II. It shall be lawful for any person, or for the servant of any person, proprietor or his on whose land any trespass is committed in contravention of this Act, to rest trespasser arrest without warrant the person in the act of so trespassing, and to bring and bring him him forthwith before a Justice of the Peace for trial on a charge of that of the Peace. 20 offence.

III. Except as herein otherwise provided, all proceedings under this provisions of Act Act shall be subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the Act to apply to propassed in the Session held in the Sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, this Act. chapter one hundred and seventy-eight, intituled "An Act to facilitate 25" the performance of the duties of Justices of the Peace out of Sessions, "in Upper Canada, with respect to summary convictions and orders,"

which shall apply to cases arising under this Act.

IV. Nothing in this Act contained shall authorize, or be construed to Justice of the authorize, any Justice of the Peace to hear and determine any case of titles to land un-30 trespass in which the title to any land, or any interest therein or accruing this Act.

thereupon, shall be called in question or affected in any manner howsoever; but every such case of trespass shall be dealt with according to law in the same manner, in all respects, as if this Act had not been passed.

35 V. This Act shall extend to Upper Canada only.
