Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 4th instant and to inform you that in accordance with your suggestion, the Storr Lot, which is numbered "15" in the plan of the Settlement at the Fairford Indian Reserve, will not be included in the Indian Reserve. You may note on the plan that the said Lot is bordered in Orange; at its North end the limit of the Hudson's Bay Company's Reserve is shown on the plan to turn North West to the River, giving the Storr Lot a frontage on the River. This is not the case in the patent issued to the Hudson's Bay Company; the Eastern boundary of the Hudson's Bay Company's Lot is produced straight North to the River. As both these lots will be excluded from the reserve it will no longer be a question for the Department to decide as to whether an error occurred in the issue of the patent or if the plan is wrong.

The Order in Council, relating to the Reserve itself, has not yet been issued; it is intended to apply for the Order in Council to include the proposed addition. The matter has been delayed until a final conclusion has been arrived at with regard to the properties which should ^{not} be included in the Indian Reserve. The said properties are coloured orange on the plan enclosed herewith. They are:-
