
Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your October report on the Oromocto Day School.

With reference to your reports on the day schools in your agency, I beg to draw your attention to official letter of October 21st, last, in which you were informed that "agents should visit each of the schools within his jurisdiction, at least once a month. Under the heading "General Remarks" agents should report fully, not only upon the buildings, equipment and premises, but also upon the character of the work in the class-room and the progress made by the pupils."


