hospital for further treatment because we were not in a position to treat these wounds ourselves.

Q- Yes. Did you see him again?

A. I saw him again about a day after that when he was all bandaged up, and he told us what sort of treatment he had received in the hospital.

Q- Did you do anything about it?

A. When he came back from the hospital we decided that he could not carry on with his duties and we gave him excused duties.

Q- How long was he away from his duty?

A. Four days.

CROSS-EXAMINED BY DEFENDING OFFICER :-

Mr. Selling, did Cpl. Williams mention to you that he had been drinking the night before the accident or the night of the accident?

A\_ No.

I would like to ask your opinion about drukenness.

I will put the question this way. In your opinion, is it
possible for a person who has been drinking, say, beer and
wine to walk about and commit certain acts or perform certain
duties and not remember having performed those duties?

A- In my opinion -- this is theoretically possible.
But I don't feel qualified to answer that question definitely.

I would like your answer to this question: Would it

be possible for a person to have committed certain acts or
said certain things while under the influence of beer and wine
or either of these and at a later time not remembering having
done certain acts or said certain things?

A. This might be possible.
