- (2) That The Canadian Press is co-operative and non-profit making, cwned, controlled and operated by Canadians and vitally concerned with the solidarity, security and progress of the Canadian people.
- (3) That The Canadian Press has access to the complete United Kingdom service of the Press association and the full world service of Reuters and has exclusive rights in Canada to all news gathered by The Associated Press of the United States in all parts of the world; and that the British and foreign service of The Canadian Press London and New York.
- (4) That The Canadian Press domestic service is collected from all the newspapers of Canada and edited for transmission in the following Canadian bureaux: Halifax, Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, Winnipeg, Edmonton and Vancouver.
- (5) That for these reasons The Canadian Press is the one service from which the Canadian people can get an untainted picture of the world's news from the Canadian point of view.

The Canadian Press after careful study makes the following suggestions to the CBC:

- (1) That the CBC prepare its own radio bulletins from the full service supplied without charge by The Canadian Press, prefacing its announcements by the CBC staff from the entire news service of The Canadian Press."
- (2) That if the present arrangement continues and the Canadian Press prepares the bulletins, the CBC co-operate in removing criticisms concerning:
  - (a) Method of preparing the bulletins;
  - (b) Method of ennouncing bulletins;
  - (c) Times of emission;

and that a joint committee of four be appointed to facilitate such co-operation.

- (3) That The Canadian Press bulletins be made available to all radio stations in Canada as sustaining programs without commercial sponsorship.
- (4) That the CBC issue over the air and to newspapers a statement declaring its recognition of the value of the Canadian Press service, especially at the present entire news service at the disposal of the CBC without charge except for incidental expenses.
