

Sorel, Nov. 5 .- An explosion took here about 9 o'clock or board the powerful dredge J. 

OUTSIDE VIEW OF CANADA.

Really Knew Nothing of Empire Pre-blems From British Standpoint.

blems Frem British Standpeint.

There are people who would regulate our British politics in some respects by what is supposed to be Canadian opinion, says The Sheffield (Eng.) Paily Independent. Let there be no mistake about this—the average intelligent interested Canadian politician knows next to nothing about British politics, has never conceived what the problems of Empire really are from the British standpoint, or realized the essential features of the commerce of the Mother Country. The most obvious and striking features of practically the whole Canadian press is its complete absorption in Canadian affairs. The great daily newspapers of the Dominion appear day after day with no word of comment on any matter that is not strictly Canadian. Ayoung, enthusiastic, and hopeful country is naturally interested in itself intensely. To the Canadians, loyal and hearty though they be, Canada is eleven-twelfths of the world, and it comes as a revelation to them nada is eleven-twelfths of the world and is eleven-twelfths of the world, and it comes as a revelation to them that England has a point of view they have never attempted to realize. The responsibility for this ignorance of the Mother Country does not lie wholly with Canada by any means, for we allow the Dominion to be largely shut off from British thought, and freely Americanized by leaving and freely Americanized, by leaving in the hands of the press agencies of the States all the dissemi-ation of news. The alienation from English thought, and the absence of the most elementary knowledge of home af-fairs, is striking. Experienced Cana-dian newspaper men will tell you in one breath that they have never one breath that they have never heard of a London daily newspaper which you read in almost any hotel on the Continent of Europe; and in the next breath they will remark that their parents were born in Yorkshire, in a place called Durham. Before we begin to attach weight to Canadian opinion on British pellics or commerce we must ask whether there is any appreciable amount of such opinion founded on knewledge and fair thought. The Associations of British Chambers of Commerce met in Montreal some weeks ago, and left the city before more than a fraction of the press men of the city were aware that that association is not a great political agency, but is a commercial organization of the pressure. heard of a London daily newspap ciation is not a great political agency, but is a commercial organization firstly, secondly, and all the way through. The fact is that Canada is at present intensely parochial in politics. She is pivoted on herself. Her aim where politics and commerce mingle is to sell all her own products—agricultural or manufacturing—at specially high prices, and she would likes England to help her; but as to the English point of view—well, it is outside the range of the average Canadian's thoughts.
