domination of the prince of darkness.

In this hope, praying God to be propitious to the prious enterprises of Christian nations, we grant you most affectionately in the Lord as a testimony of our special good will, the apostolic benediction, to you, Venerable Brothers, to the clergy and people confided to your charge.
