DIASSTERS AT SEA.—The Bark Navarino, which underwent repairs here during the summer after being wrecked on her voyage to Quebec, has met with another accident, we are sorry to find. Edward Petricrew, pilot No. 8, who arrived here yesterday, reports that he took the Navarino going into Gaspe Bay to get, having lost topmasts, jib-boom, and fut-works, in a gale, on the 27th ultimo. The Navarino cleared from here on the 29th ult. for Liverpool. The pilot likewise reports that four schooners were wrecked on the coast, in the vicinity of Gaspe, during the gale in which the Navarino suffered.

A letter was received yesterday from the Agent of Lloyds, at Sydney, (Cape Breton), announcing that the new schooner Rival, 191 tons burthen, built by Mr. Oliver of Quebec, this summer, and which cleared on the 30th Aug. for Belfast, was found on the 20th ult. by the brig British Queen, Humber, waterlogged and abandoned at sea. C. J. Hooper left the mate of his vessel in charge of the Rival, which has been brought into Sydney; her hull is not much injured, but her sails, running rigging, &c. were gone.

Like the Navarino, this is the second disaster within a short time that the Rival has met with. She had not been long away from port, on her first sailing, when she had to put back for repairs.
