Provided, that after the expiration of fifty years, to be a counted from the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty. his heirs and facceffors, to affume the poffession and property of the faid bridge, toll-house, turnpike, and dependencies, and the alcents and the approaches thereto. upon paying to the laid François Verrault; his heirs, executors, curators, or affigus, the full and entire value which the fame may, at the time of fuch affumption; bear and be worth; and when and to foon as the faid buildge: that be erected and builts. and made fit and proper for the passage of travellers, cattleand carriages, and that also same shall be certified by any two or more I astices of the Peace, for the District of Quebec, after examination thereof, by the ee Experts, to be appointed and fwom by the faid Justices of the Peace, and be advertised in the Quebec Gazette, in fluit be lawful for the faid François Verrault, his heirs, executors, curators and affigues, from time to time and at all times, to ask, demand, receive, recover, and take toll, and sop his own proper use and behoof, for Pontage, or anothe name of a toll or duty, the fore any passage of the said bridge, shall be permitted, the several same following, that is to fay: for every Coach for other four wheeled Carriage, loaded or unloaded, with the Driver and four Persons, or less, drawn by two or more horses or other beasts of draught, one shilling and three pence; currency; for every waggon or other four-wheeled carriage, loaded or unloaded, one shilling currency: for every chaile, calash, chair, with two wheels or cariole, or other such carriage, loaded or unloaded, with the driver and two persons on less drawn by two horses or other beafts of draught, four pence, currency, and drawn by one horse or other beaft of draught, three pence, currency; for every care, fled nor other fuch carriage, loaded or unloaded, drawn by two horses, oxen or other beatts of draught; with the driver, four-pence, currency; and drawn by one horse; or other beaft of draughts three-pence, currency; for every perion on foot, one half-penny; currency; for every holfe, mare, mule, or other beaft of draught, laden or unladen, one-penny, halfpenny, currency; for every person on horseback, two pence, currency; for every bull, ox, cow, and all other horned and neat cattle, each, one penny, currency : for every hog, goat, theep, calf or lamb, one-half penny, currency.
