PROPERTY OF CANADIAN HOME WEST LAND REGULATIONS.
THE sole head of a family, or any male over 21 years of age, may homestead a vacant parcel of land in the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Application must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Application may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after carrying homesteaded parcel; also 20 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homesteaded parcel, on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon acquisition of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$2.00 per acre.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchase mortgage in certain districts. Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 20 acres and erect a house worth \$500.

The area cultivated is subject to reduction in case of rough scrubby or stony land. Five acres may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
