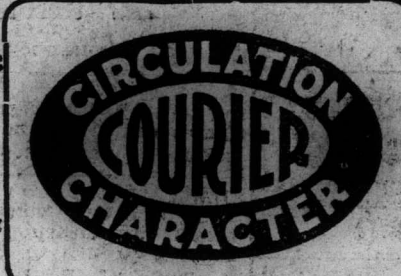

OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BRANTFORD TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUE OF DEBENTURES FOR THE SUBSIDY OF THE ST. PAUL AVENUE SUBWAY.
WHEREAS it is desirable for the safety and convenience of the public that a subway should be constructed at St. Paul's avenue under the tracks of the Grand Trunk Railway Company to provide for separation of grade.
AND WHEREAS in order thereto it will be necessary to issue debentures of this Corporation for the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000), which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this by-law.
