STILL FALLING

Yukon Recedes One and One-Half Inches Since Yesterday

The water in the Yukon river in front of Dawson was lower at 12 o'clock today by 1 1/2 inches than at the corresponding hour yesterday.

The report of the river and weather along the Yukon is as follows: Forty-mile—Yukon still pretty solid.

Stewart river—Yukon rising fast, can still cross on ice.

Yukon crossing—Crossing open. General appearance very shaky.

Selwyn—River still solid.

Lower Lebarge—Freighting on lake stopped till Fifty-mile river opens.

Lake-still solid.

Hootaliqua—Hootaliqua open for about a mile at the mouth. Yukon open for about 30 miles north of Hootaliqua.

Whitehorse—Ice out for about 10 miles down. Water very low.

Ogilvie—Water rising, jam at foot of island.

Big Salmon—River solid.
