

GRAND ORANGE LODGE OPENED.

The Reports Tell of a Progressive Year.

St. Stephen, March 8.—The first session of the Grand Orange Lodge was held this evening, the grand master presiding. A cordial welcome was read by the grand master, who master of the lodge, in which he recalled that in twenty years since St. Stephen was favored with the presence of the Grand Lodge and assured that the hearts of more than 300 members in Charlotte county to them welcome.

The members of the Grand Orange Association will hail with delight the consummation of a policy that will make our empire more united and powerful than in the past. He had visited seventeen primary lodges and several country lodges. He advocated strongly the insurance branch of the order and the support of the Orange Sentinel.

An eloquent tribute was paid to brothers who had departed life during the year. He commended the system of propagation followed during the year, which had resulted in the greatest increase of membership in the history of the association.

He commended the members upon their energy in erecting new halls and improving those already occupied, he expressed sympathy with Japan in her struggle with Russia and spoke of the arrival in Canada of members of the order of the church of Rome who had been expelled from France. He expressed his appreciation of the assistance given him by members of the order and a hope that a large measure of success might attend their labors in the future.

The Secretary's report showed the Order to be in a flourishing condition.

Joined by certificate, 130.

Withdrawn by certificate, 60.
Suspended, six.

Making a total gain of membership for the year 705.

H. G. Wainman, grand treasurer, reported a very successful financial year.

There was a balance on hand of between \$400 and \$1,500. The year has been the best in the history of the grand lodge.


Owing to the bad snow-storms which we have had the Caraque train is unable to keep the track open which is a great disadvantage to the people. The mails have to come by team.
