



Untold mineral wealth underlays the soil, waiting for time and invested capital ere an idea can be conceived as to its intrinsic value and the benefits which will accrue to Calgary, Canada, and the British Empire therefrom. Chief among the minerals and other products of the lower stratas of the earth, found in the Calgary district are iron, lead, coal (bituminous, lignite, anthracite and coking), silicate sandstone brick clay and shale, pottery clay, fire clay, etc. Oil, of a high grade was, on October 7th, 1913, struck at depth of 1562 feet in a well on Section 6, Township 20, Range 2, West of the 5th Meridian, and now known as "Discovery Well," and since in fairly good quantities in at least two other. wells. a large quantity of gasoline, The hospitals of Calgary, which were hitherto managed by private individuals, are now, in so far as possible, administered by a Board known as the "Calgary Hospitals' Board." This Board is composed of three representatives elected by the subscribers of the old General Hospital Board, four members either elected or appointed by the medical men of the City, six members elected by the citizens of Calgary, and the Mayor. The latter is chairman of the said Board and has an ordinary vote, and in the event of an equality of votes a casting vote on all questions submitted to the said Board.

A Tuberculosis Hospital is operated by the Hospitals' Board for the treatment of sufferers from this disease, Calgary's excellent climate drawing many patients to this vicinity.
