They are now (Sunday evening), sweeping up the valley to wards Coal Creek and the only escape left to people of that town is by difficult travel over mountains. They will have to leave all property behind. There are only a half dozen dwellings standing in Fernie. The loss is two and a half millions, and five thousand people are homeless. Large numbers of casualties have occurred and the hospital trains have been sent from Cranbrook with doctor and nurses. Two hundred men are fighting an almost hopeless battle to save the town of Hosmer. Five families in that neighborhood are entirely sur rounded by flames and may perish. The great northern bridge at Hosmer is burning and one hundred and fifty cars with coal and coke have burned. Nelson, B. C. has been asked for help.
