LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS.

FRESH herring were caught in Georgetown harbor by Capt. Henry Gossie yesterday morning.

STAVES, I. C. R. stationmaster at Dartmouth, N. S., was arrested on Saturday evening on the alleged charge of being a defaulter to the amount of \$5,000.

It is reported that Sir Thomas Lipton has ordered his sailmaker to produce a pure silk spinaker for the use of the challenger in light wind. This is the first silk sail known of.

SENATOR Miller, of Arichat, had a dangerous attack of illness in Ottawa a few days ago, and was in a critical condition. The last sacraments were administered to him.

ALL lightships along the St. Lawrence are ordered into operation to-day. Boats were sent out from Quebec on Saturday. This is the earliest opening of the St. Lawrence navigation on record.

REPORTS from St. John's, Nfld., say that sailing steamers arriving in port give 238 seals as the aggregate catch of fourteen steamers, constituting two thirds of the fleet. It is expected the total catch will reach 350,000.

THE steamer Hillsborough is now running on the Southport Ferry. She started on Thursday last, but could only get about two thirds of the distance across, and landed her passengers on the ice. She is now going from wharf to wharf.

WHAT freaks the mails take! Yesterday three steamers crossed between this Province and Pictou, still we had no foreign mail last night. The Stanley could not get into Georgetown on account of thick weather. The mails went by the Minto this morning.

THE Stanley went to Pictou, from Georgetown on Saturday and the Minto came over to Georgetown with freight passengers and mail. The Minto returned to Pictou on Monday and yesterday came to Charlottetown arriving at 10.30 a. m.

THE novitiate of the Most Holy Brothers at St. Hyacinthe, P. Q., was completely destroyed by fire from an over-heated furnace on Sunday night last. The inmates were asleep when the fire broke out, and only managed to escape down the fire escapes in their night clothes, leaving all their effects behind.

MA. John A. McDonald has resigned the clerkship of the Legislative Assembly, and is succeeded in the office of clerk by Mr. Robert H. Montgomery, of St. Eleanora. Mr. McDonald had discharged the duties of the office most efficiently and conscientiously, and members of both sides of the House expressed their appreciation of his abilities in that capacity.

A MESSAGE sent by Mr. James Paton by wireless telegraph from the steamer Umbria in the Atlantic ocean was received in this city Monday, and published in the Patriot. It was sent from the steamer some two or three hundred miles from the coast of Ireland, to the Marconi station at Crookhaven, in the County Cork, and thence despatched to this side of the Atlantic. Mr. Paton is on his way home.

RELIGION on labor was the theme of Rev. Dr. Morrison's sermon in St. Dunstan's Cathedral Sunday evening last. His text was from the 14th verse of the 13th chapter of St. Matthew: "Not in bread alone doth man live, but in every word that proceedeth from the mouth of God." The development of labor was traced by the reverend preacher from the sentence pronounced against Adam: "In labor and toil shalt thou eat thereof all the days of thy life," until labor was embodied in the person of our Divine Redeemer who was reputed to be "the carpenter, the son of Mary." The influence of religion and the connection it should have with labor properly directed were pointed out. Labor, whether by the individual or in the immense soulless corporations, when completely devoid of all religious influence can not bring about the desired results that should flow therefrom when sanctified by religion. Labor unions and the good they may accomplish when directed under religious influences, and the great danger attached to them when not properly guided, were referred to. In labor as in everything else, religion is what sanctifies those engaged therein and makes their lives on earth a preparation for an eternity of happiness hereafter.

WE regret to record the death of Mr. James R. McLean, which took place at Souris on Thursday last, after a lingering illness. He was a native of East Point, and was 61 years of age at the time of his death. For many years he carried on a mercantile business at Souris, and from his earliest years took an active interest in politics. He was first elected to the House of Assembly in 1893, and held his seat till 1897, when he was defeated by Mr. John McLean. He was again elected in 1898, 1899, 1900, 1901 and 1902. He contested the County of St. John's for the House of Commons in 1897, but was unsuccessful. In 1891 he became a member of the House of Commons, taking the office of Commissioner of Public Works. This office he held till the general election of 1900, when he was not a candidate for the Legislature. He was twice married, first in 1870, to a daughter of the late Hon. Joseph Wright, and secondly, a few years ago, to a Miss McDonald, of Souris, with three children, including Mr. James McLean, of the Balfour and Murray Harbor construction society, survive him. When the news of his death reached here, suitable reference was made thereto in the Legislature by the Premier, Hon. Mr. Gordon, Mr. John McLean and others. His funeral took place to St. Mary's, Souris, on Saturday, and was largely attended. A High Mass of Requiem was celebrated by Rev. Dr. McDonald, P. P., assisted by Rev. Dr. Walker. A special train from Charlottetown brought a number from the city, including the Hon. Ernest Gordon, Mr. McIntyre, the Commissioner of Public Works, Hon. Jas. W. Richards, Judge Warburton and Benjamin Rogers. Those in attendance also included John McLean, M. L. A., John Kitchman, M. L. A., Lauchlin McDonald, East Point, etc. The pall bearers were John McLean, M. L. A., E. F. McDonald, C. H. Starnes, A. E. Clarke and Capt. Donald McDonald. After the Mass and Libera the mortal remains were laid to rest in the adjoining cemetery. R. I. P.

Ottawa Weekly Letter.

WEEK IN PARLIAMENT.

The week in Parliament was an interesting one. On the budget debate, Mr. R. L. Borden and Mr. F. D. Monk criticised the Government's actions and demanded that its fiscal policy should be announced. Sir Wilfrid Laurier, in reply, told the House that the Fielding tariff of 1897 embodied the Liberal Policy.

Hon. Charles E. Fitzpatrick defeated the action of the government in pardoning Arthur Brunet, the scoundrel who stole the parliamentary seat for St. James Division.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier, on Wednesday explained his reasons for demanding Mr. Tarte's resignation. Mr. Tarte, replying, denied that he had been compelled to resign, and accused Laurier of deceit and unfair treatment of an old friend.

The Liberal policy was again assailed, and the opposition asked whether the Free Trade or Protectionist ministers are to be accepted as authorities on the tariff. It was shown that Hon. Messrs. Blair, Sifton and Prefontaine had violated the constitution quite as much as Mr. Tarte, but they were still in office. Mr. Tarte made a most important statement in saying that the accepted policy of the Liberal party last year was "higher duties."

Mr. Fielding admitted deceiving the manufacturers by making promises he had no intention of carrying out.

In supply it was shown that the Minister of Justice has systematically used the appointment of judges to serve political ends.

Main estimates for \$57,109,974 were brought down, showing an increase of \$3,548,336 as compared with last year.

Attention was called to the irregularity of Sir Oliver Mowat holding office as Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario after his term had expired. Sir Wilfrid, who condemned such practices when in opposition, declared them to be all right under Liberal auspices.

THE FIELDING TARIFF STANDS.

The Free Trade element in the Liberal party will hardly find comfort in Sir Wilfrid Laurier's definite announcement, that the Liberal policy is embodied in the Fielding tariff of 1897, and that the government is prepared to stand by it. It means that supporters of lower duties will be compelled to look elsewhere for relief. Those favoring higher protection are placed in the same position. Hon. Raymond Prefontaine, who lent himself to high protectionists during the by-election in Missisquoi, was warned by his leader that he must find in the Fielding tariff all the protection he desires. The hint is significant. It is a straight warning that Mr. Tarte will not be the only one to suffer Sir Wilfrid's displeasure if there is any more high protection talk in cabinet circles. No matter what may be the weaknesses of Mr. Fielding's Law, it is now the fixed policy of the administration. Delegations of farmers and manufacturers were here this week protesting against the prevailing conditions. They demand consideration but the government is determined to close its eyes and place party above all else.

SHIELDING THE CRIMINALS.

The charges made by R. R. Gamay in the Ontario House have developed to a greater degree than ever the apathy shown by the Ross Government for fair play, when their own disgraceful methods are called into question. A commission of inquiry has been proposed. This tribunal is authorized to investigate certain charges against Hon. J. R. Stratton. There its duties will cease, although Mr. Gamay has made straight accusations against three other members of the government, Hon. G. W. Ross, Hon. Mr. Gibson and Hon. Frank Latchford. Mr. Donald Sutherland and Dr. Rheame, Conservative members have also charged the Liberal party with endeavoring to buy their votes. But none of these allegations can be heard by the special tribunal. Hon. Mr. Latchford, on the floor of the House had the audacity to offer Mr. Hugh Clark the patronage of Centre Bridge, if he, too, would sign an agreement to support the Liberal party. This for brazen effrontery is perhaps the worst feature of the government's position. Yet it cannot be ventilated by the special R. R. tribunal. One charge only will be considered. The criminals will take no greater chances than they are absolutely compelled to. This is the course offered in vindication of an aggregation whose whole political existence forms one of the blackest records that ever darkened the public life of a civilized country. It is an attempt to legalize crime and still punishment of the culprit. But it will doubtless receive the condemnation it deserves, when Ontario is next heard from through the polls.

EXPENDITURE TAKES ANOTHER JUMP.

Another chapter is added to the story of Liberal extravagance. Despite the warnings from all sides, that the seven fat years should be made sponsor for the inevitable seven lean years, the Laurier government continues to add to the expenses of administration. The main estimates for 1903-04 when brought down, showed a total of \$57,109,974 as against \$53,561,638 in 1902-03. The enormous increase of \$3,548,336 means a still further levy on the pockets of the people and more money in the pockets of favored individuals. The Intercolonial Railway is alone responsible for \$1,000,000 of the growth of the new estimates. Sir Richard Cartwright's department of Trade and Commerce is another of the worst offenders and claims an increase of \$444,000. This is a splendid criterion of how the taxation reducer of Canada lives up to his promises. He breaks every pledge with an ease that is almost incredible. With the supplementary estimates the aggregate vote will be in the vicinity of \$70,000,000 or \$30,000,000 more than under Conservative rule.

GOVERNMENT DEFENDS BRUNET'S PARDON.

Parliament has been promised particulars relating to the pardon of Arthur Brunet, the rascal who stole Mr. J. G. H. Bergeron's seat in St. James' Division, Montreal. The government has even offered a defence through Hon. Charles Fitzpatrick, Minister of Justice. The excuse, however, is as lame as it is startling. Mr. Fitzpatrick argues that, because certain persons whom he prosecuted away back in 1880 for alleged irregularities of the Brunet type, but whom he was unable to convict, were Conservatives, Arthur Brunet's crimes were worthy of pardon. Mr. Fitzpatrick is now prepared to claim that a man convicted of scandalous crimes is better in 1903, than one who was held by the Courts to be innocent in 1880. Evidently the Minister of Justice was persecutor as well as prosecutor in 1880. The reason for his conduct in the Brunet case seems to have been based on the fact that the prisoner's crimes elected a Liberal who has been disqualified for seven years. Is it not a disgrace to Canada that such an attitude should be assumed by the Minister responsible for British justice in this country?

MINISTERS WITHOUT PRINCIPLE.

The debate on the explanation of Hon. J. Israel Tarte's retirement from the cabinet brought out most important inside history of the Liberal party's attitude towards the tariff. Mr. Tarte stated that last year the government decided to raise the duties, as the result of irresistible pressure from departments of manufacturers, farmers and workingmen. Governed by this decision, he presided the doctrine of "Canada for Canadians." Delegations have been promised protection, which was to be brought down this session. There was a distinct understanding on this score. But Mr. Fielding now denies and claims that it was a bluff to get clear of the manufacturers, who are bound to come back year after year. The different industries were simply played for what they were worth politically, and then betrayed. Sir Wilfrid, too, added another to his long list of inconsistencies by declaring that while he was a protectionist in the green days of his youth, he was now a Free Trader. Only a few days before, he declared the Fielding tariff of twenty-five per cent to be his policy. Without policy and principle actuating the man at the head of her affairs, Canada is indeed worthy of pity.

TARTE SAYS LAURIER PREVARICATED.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier's explanation of Hon. J. Israel Tarte's resignation was a painful incident. To see the head of the government endeavoring to misrepresent the man who placed him in power suggested base ingratitude. Sir Wilfrid told the Commons, that he had dismissed his former colleague. This Mr. Tarte declared to be false. Sir Wilfrid had been handed his resignation but requested that Mr. Tarte should keep it for two days. Mr. Tarte then left for Toronto but resigned in the meantime, and with the resignation in his hand, and during Mr. Tarte's absence, Sir Wilfrid by a smart trick endeavored to make it appear that he had pushed his friend out into the cold. Mr. Tarte was plotted against by his teachers and companions and gave up in disgust. At a given signal from Mr. Sifton, he was abused by influential Liberal organs, but he told his persecutors that, while he is prepared to suffer for mistakes, he is unwilling to submit to misrepresentation at the hands of Sir Wilfrid. For the second time in his life Mr. Tarte has pronounced Sir Wilfrid traitor. The only end served by such tactics is to hide the identity of Mr. Tarte's would be political assassins.

BLAIR DOES NOT RESPECT THE LAW.

The cool way in which Hon. A. G. Blair overrides the law and illegally spends capital account funds has developed into a standing scandal. When the Minister of Railways asks a vote from Parliament, he makes a practice of placing it at a modest figure. Later on he exceeds the appropriation and draws on special account for large amounts. A big kick was made last session against such loose methods but the past year has developed even worse conditions. The Auditor-General, in his report for 1902, publishes correspondence showing irregularities of this character:

In six accounts Mr. Blair has exceeded his allowance by \$65,280. He is absolutely without authority for his conduct and practically placed himself above all law. It is such methods as these that have increased the cost of the capital invested in the Intercolonial since Mr. Blair assumed control of it.

Worst Year Yet For Intercolonial.

The year 1902 was to the Intercolonial Railway the most disastrous in its history. Hon. A. G. Blair fairly sold himself, his capital expenditure reaching the enormous dimensions of \$5,102,558. In 1872 and 1873, when the road was in construction, the capital outlay was \$5,131,141 and \$5,019,230 respectively. But in no other year has capital account been called upon to meet the expenditures within millions of Mr. Blair's 1902 disbursements. In the tall-tale figures to be found a ready and dismal explanation of Mr. Blair's alleged surplus of \$98,000 on the operations for 1902. He has added to Canada's annual interest charges a burden of \$153,085. He has given an increase of debt totalling millions, and insults public intelligence by announcing a childish surplus of \$98,000. Were the surplus ten times what it is claimed to be, it would afford little consolation for those who are interested in the true welfare of our national finances. So far we have nothing to consider but the deficit in the aggregate. We must be patient and seek the Auditor General's version of Mr. Blair's methods in order to see how he managed to rid himself of the \$5,102,558. To those who believe in government ownership of railways, Mr. Blair offers comfort indeed.

The Redistribution Bill.

The redistribution bill submitted to the House of Commons provides that Prince Edward Island shall have but four members. King's County is to have one, Prince one and Queen's two. What now does all the talk and delegations on this matter amount to? We shall refer to this matter later.

High Water.

Recent advice say that never but twice in its history have there been such floods in the city of Montreal or has the water reached the figure obtained lately; at midnight one night the gauge at the harbor office indicated 42 feet 3 inches, which is 2 feet 2 inches lower than highest mark obtained in flood in 1886 and 1 foot 11 inches lower than highest mark in 1887. The ice jam which extended from Ile Bonite well down the river to a point opposite the House of Industry and refuge was one solid mass of unknown thickness and from indications looked as if it would be some days before it would give away.

THE IRISH LAND BILL.

The Irish secretary Wyndham, introduced the Government's long anticipated Irish Land Bill in the House of Commons last Wednesday afternoon, which proposes a free grant of \$60,000,000 for purposes of the bill. Tenants are to pay 2½ per cent interest on loan from the Government. Wyndham said he thought the scheme would not involve \$600,000,000, but that \$75,000,000 could satisfactorily be advanced on Irish land. Advances to tenants have been limited to \$500 in congested districts and \$500 elsewhere. The bill also provides that untenanted farms and grazing lands shall be sold to neighboring tenants and that three commissioners shall supervise the sales. They will be under the general control of the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and become effective on November 1st.
