Synopsis of Canadian North West Land Regulations

Any person who is the sole head of family, or any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of svailable Dominion land in Manliobs Saskatchewan or Alberta. The appli can must appear in person at the Domin on Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be n ade at any agency, on certait con itions by father, mother, son, dat, hter, brother or sister hon esteader.

Onties-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each three years. A homesteader may ijv within nine miles of his homestead or farm of it least 80 scres solely cuper and occupied by sim or by his father mo her, son, daughter, brother or sis
