all trains stop there. Mr. Frampton,
who will be the only person directly
interested, is to be congratulated in
his enterprise and it is to be hoped
that the project will materialize.

Sydney Man Killed by Auto.

News of the death of a former
Sydney man comes from Houston,
Texas. The intimation came in a let-
ter from Mark Outram, an old Sydney
boy, to Lauchlin Corbett, of West-
mount, and said the man's name was
Rod McDonald, a sailor, whose papers
and letters showed that he was a na-
tive of Sydney.
McDonald was struck and killed by
an automobile while crossing the
street. The deceased was awaiting
the sailing of his steamer, apparently,
which was loading cotton in Houston.
Mr. Outram, who is well known to
the older inhabitants of Sydney, is do-
ing well in the Texas city, and owns a
large and flourishing hotel business.

Weekly Report

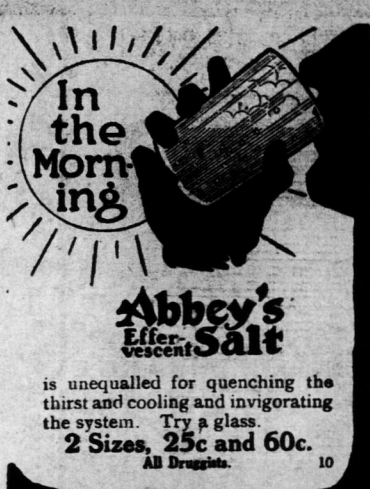
The Council of the Board of Trade

Armed Guards at Rockefeller's Home.

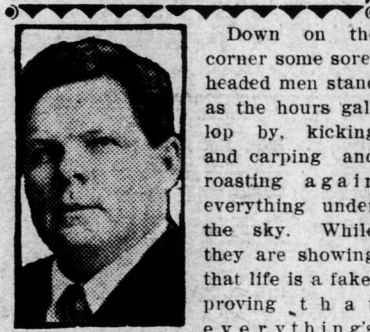
New York, Sept. 3.—The large force
of armed guards which has been sta-
tioned around John D. Rockefeller's
estate at Pocantico Hills, near Tarry-
town, for the last two weeks, was es-
tablished because of death threats re-
ceived by Mr. Rockefeller himself, and
members of his family, according to
the World to-day. There have been
numerous disorders among foreigners
employed on the estate, but it is said
that this is not the main reason for the
precautions which Mr. Rockefeller has
taken. Eighteen negro deputy
sheriffs and a squad of detectives, all
armed, constitute the guard. Accord-
ing to the World, Mr. Rockefeller and
his son have received a number of
letters threatening both their lives
and property, and demanding heavy
ransom. Threats to kidnap John D.
Rockefeller, Jr.'s two young children,
who are ill with measles at a nursery
on the estate, have also been received,
it is said.
