Bell Island Mines.

It has been freely rumoured for some time that the great iron mines on Bell Island are about to be sold, or are at least under option, to the United States Steel Co.; and while rumours are often nothing more they have sometimes a way of becoming cold and uncompromising fact. We are moved to wonder whether the Government have considered what may be the result if that should happen in this case. By force of necessity, the lack of coal and other essentials, we were in the past compelled, or found it advisable, to sell to Canadian companies the ownership of these tremendously valuable mines, the country getting the benefit of the purchase price, much local labour and an export duty levied upon the ore shipped to Nova Scotia. For the interests of the country it may or may not have been regrettable that this was done and that the deposits could not be worked locally; but the corporations that took them over were at least subject to the jurisdiction of a sister colony. 
