Ottawa is in the grip of one of the most serious smallpox epidemics in its history, and the disease which all the year has been confined to certain sections is now prevalent all over the city.

From December eighteen to January twelve the crown forces have "committed thirty seven murders, fifty two attempted murders and wounding, burned seventy eight homes and shops, and that in not a single case has any punishment been inflicted."

### Founder of Guy's Hospital.

A curious story is told of the manner in which Guy's Hospital came into being. Guy, the founder, was a bookseller, who kept a shop at the Junction of Lombard Street and Cornhill. Here he sold bibles and various educational and theological works. He speculated shrewdly, and is said to have been one of the few men who bought and sold South Sea stock at the right time.

The story goes that he was so thrifty that he dined on his shop counter with a newspaper as a tablecloth. He fell in love with his servant-maid, and under the influence of the tender passion actually ordered that the pavement in front of his shop should be repaired.

While he was out the girl told the workmen to repair a portion beyond the limit Guy had fixed, saying "Tell him I bid you; he won't mind." But Guy did mind. He was wild. He broke off the engagement, renounced the idea of marriage, and took to founding hospitals and almshouses. He died at the age of eighty, after endowing his great hospital with £200,000.

### Cause of Northern Lights

From many points in Canada and in the Northern States came reports of brilliant displays of Northern Lights (Aurora Borealis) in August, and again in September. Millions of persons asked the question, what are they? The latest scientific explanation is given by Dr. S. Chapman in a bulletin of the British Institution of Electrical Engineers.

"Magnetic disturbances and aurora," writes Dr. Chapman, "are produced by the injection into the earth's atmosphere of electric corpuscles projected in confined streams from the disturbed regions of the sun. These streams may be emitted in any direction, so far as we know to terrestrial observers only when a stream is projected so that, in the course of the solar rotation, it sweeps over the earth. The streams are often of considerable angular diameter--a. g. 10 degrees or more."

At the angular diameter of the earth, viewed from the sun, is only 18.6 seconds of arc, it becomes completely enveloped in the streams; and often remains so for hours or even days, notwithstanding that the relative speed of the streams at the distance of the earth enables them to sweep right across the earth in thirty-five seconds. The latter fact explains why magnetic storms, the particularly intense and world-wide disturbances which occur when the earth is enveloped in a dense solar stream, are observed to commence at almost the same instant all over the earth.

### Different Forms of Aurora.

"There are many different forms of aurora--in particular, arcs, streamers, curtains and corona. But it seems not unlikely that all, or nearly all, these are merely different aspects of aggregations of one elemental unit, the simple streamer or ray. When certain aurora are viewed from a point directly beneath them they are seen to consist of a thin wavy and discontinuous series of vertical streamers. The auroral corona appears to be formed of a rather different arrangement of similar rays.

"This unity of composition" agrees with the evidence of height determination (which show that all types of aurora are situated at approximately the same level) in indicating that there is no essential physical difference between the various forms. The lower limit of height is 100 kilometres above the ground, very nearly, in all cases.

"Vegard states that no aurora has been certainly proved to extend downwards below a height of ninety-five kilometres. The great majority lie between 100 and 130 kilometres, and within this range there are two well-

marked levels of maximum frequency of occurrence, corresponding to lower limits of 100 and 106 kilometres.
