WASHINGTON, Sept. 3.
The ships Bowdoin and Peary of the MacMillan Arctic exploration expedition have been at Sukkertoppen, the Venice of Greenland, since Sunday, awaiting calmer weather before continuing the voyage southward, according to radio messages received this afternoon, via Battle Harbour, Labrador.

ARGENTINE PAYS LEAGUE QUOTA.

BUENOS AIRES, Sept. 3.
Although the Argentine has not yet resumed relations with the League of Nations by maintaining a representative at Geneva, the Foreign Office today ordered the payment of the country's quota for the support of the League, amounting to one hundred and sixty-seven thousand dollars.

NOVA SCOTIA'S NEW LOAN.

HALIFAX, Sept. 3.
The Nova Scotia Government is calling for bids on a bond issue of 4 million dollars for twenty years, ten years, three years and two years, with interest at four and four and a half per cent., the bids to be opened on September 15th.

MASTER REPRIMANDED.

MONTREAL, Sept. 3.
Captain C. K. Williamson, Master of the steamer Essex County, which stranded near Basot Bluff, Anticosti Island, August 20th, was severely reprimanded by the Dominion Wreck Commissioner, Captain Demers. The other officers were relieved of responsibility for the disaster.

WYOMING COWBOY SUCCEEDS TO PEERAGE.

LONDON, Sept. 8.
The Earl of Portsmouth died in London last night and is succeeded in the title by Oliver Henry Wallop, a Wyoming cowboy and ranchman, a younger brother, who becomes the eighth Earl.

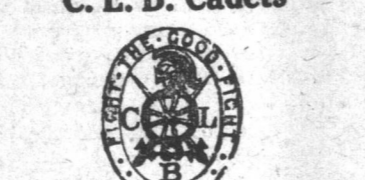

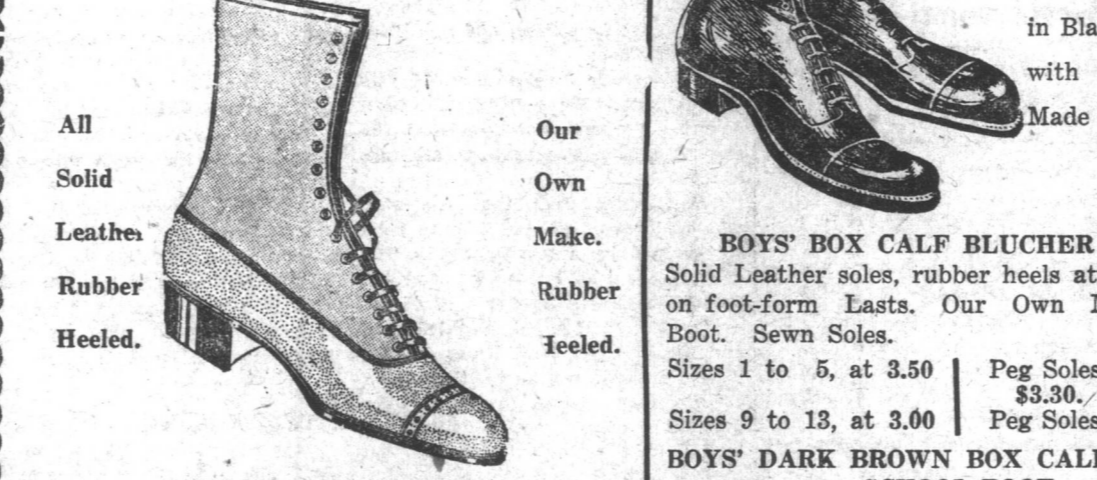

weight of 50,000 tons, partly by compressed air, while a tunnel is being driven beneath them in connection with the reconstruction of the Bond-street underground station of the Central London Railway.

The problem confronting the engineers was how best to carry the weight of the six-storey buildings with a 70-foot frontage on the side of Oxford-street, opposite the main entrance to the station, while the shaft is being excavated beneath them.

Steel Supports.

The foundations of the buildings—which include one of the largest restaurants in London—are between 35 and 40 feet below the street, and their immense weight is borne by about a dozen steel columns on wide concrete foundations, each column taking stresses of from 100 to 750 tons. Underneath is clay, and it is through this that the tunnel is being constructed.

To provide a still greater measure of support for the buildings the engineers are making use of compressed air, and the excavation is proceeding for 24 hours a day, the workmen going on in three shifts.

The downward pressure of the buildings is approximately four tons per square foot, and the upward pressure of the compressed air counteracts it to the extent of about one ton per square foot.

So elaborate have been the precautions taken to avoid the subsidence of the properties overhead that no danger whatever exists.
