The Proposed Bieycle Track.

To the Editor of the Advertiser:

I have read with interest your editorial in Thursday's Advertisers, under heading "Bieycle Track for London," and whilst concurring heartily with many of the views expressed, it occurred to me that your remarks relative to the action of the London Bieycle Club might possibly mislead the public regarding the really good intentions of that organization. At the recent meeting of the Western Fair Board I had the honor—in conjunction with Drs. Belton and Balfour—of representing the club in question, and I can say that we attended that meeting just as much in the city's interests as any member of the Western Fair Board. We are willing as a club to donate up to \$500, for the purpose of building a track, a sum equal to that of the Western Fair Board, and such being the case, we had a perfect right to a voice in its management. Indeed, to my mind the track would be far better in the hands of a live cycling organization than under the exclusive control of the Western Fair Board, who have already so much other business to occupy their time and attention. The London Bieyele Club, Mr. Editor, as you doubtless know, is a hustling institution; the youngest of the clubs, its membership already exceeds by far that of the three other clubs put together; still we desire no "sectional predominancy." Like your good self we dislike menopolies. Our aim is to foster and strengthen that good fellowship which already prevails among wheelmen everywhere, and bring the hubblic to realize as soon as possible what cycling really is—the greatest sport in creation. As a matter of fact our offerwas one of extreme liberality and the benefits small in comparison. Your present proposition, that the Western Fair Board and the City Council build the track jointly suits us exactly, but by all means let there be expediency. Of one thing I am sure, that when operations are commenced the London Bicycle Club will not be found lacking in that spirit of enterprise and liberality which has been
