GALES AND TIDAL WAVE
NO CONCESSIONS
WHILE WAR LASTS
Reforms Demanded by People
of Russia Will Not Be
Granted.

St. Petersburg, Dec. 21. — Emperor
Nicholas is holding councils daily at
Tsarsko-Zelo, at which the situation in
Russia is being thoroughly discussed. Among
those who are attending the councils are
Grand Duke Michael, the brother
of the Emperor; ministers and mem-
bers of the council of the empire, in-
cluding Prince Sviatopolk-Mirsky, Min-
ister of the Interior; M. Witte, presi-
dent of the ministerial council; M. Po-
dodonostoff, procurator-general of the
Holy Synod; M. Muraviev, Minister of
Justice; M. Kovalev, Minister of
Finance; Count Vorontzoff-Dashkoff,
head of the Russian Red Cross;
Count Solovki and M. M. Ermoloff,
British, Rother and Hesse.

Prince Sviatopolk-Mirsky laid before
the council the addresses and resolu-
tions adopted by the congress of
zemstvos, which was held here last
month. Prince Sviatopolk-Mirsky, M.
Witte and Count Solovki favored a pol-
icy of concession, but the others op-
posed such a policy on the ground
that the demands of the zemstvos
were contrary to the essential prin-
ciples of the autocracy.

In the opinion of the council it is
not the time to enter into a policy
looking to a change in the existing
form of government while war is in
progress, and it was decided to dis-
courage political action. Measures
will be drawn up relative to the dis-
cussion consequent upon mobilization.
There is no confirmation of the re-
port that Vice Admiral Rozhdestvensky
has been appointed commander-in-
chief of the Pacific squadron and that
Admiral Skrydlov is to become a mem-
ber of the ministry.
