canon on marriage and divorce, forbidding the remarriage of any divorced person until he or she has obtained a decree absolutely the same as that which was rejected by the House of Deputies in 1907. It was not unexpected, as the sentiment of that body was well known. In fact, a slight amendment to the canon passed at the San Francisco convention three years ago, but failed, as was the case with the canon on marriage, when introduced at another house. A conference of committees, representing the bishops and the laity, had been held to settle the disagreement, but leading clergymen did not anticipate that the deputies would accept the canon as it had been passed. Among the other amendments presented was one which provides that a divorced man should not be readmitted to the sacraments. There is a provision, however, that the sacraments shall not be refused to a divorced man unless he is in danger of death, or to any person who shall solemnly aver that he
