

Ask for all necessary particulars, study its past history, its present position, its capital, its reserve, etc. These figures may be obtained by a reference to its advertisements, etc. THEN AGAIN, if your neighbor offered you a rate of interest for your money that was higher than current rates, you would be led to the conclusion, and properly so, that the risk you were being asked to take was above the average. If a bank offers you special inducements in order to attract a loan from you, why not reach the same conclusion. As a rule the higher the rate the greater the risk
