STOVE LIDS FLY AT CONSTABLES

Indians At Medina On Brant Reserve Resent Officers' Invasion.

Rout Party Sent To Evict Squatter From Disputed Farm.

BRANTFORD, April 20.—"The days of the warring Indians are not over," commented one of the officials at the police station here today. A party of police officers wended their way to a farm at Medina on the Indian Reserve, to seize a farm or eject the occupant, when a "free-for-all" started.

High County Constable Kerr, in charge of a party of police, went to Hill's Farm at Medina, with an order from the sheriff's office in Brantford, to evict an Indian squatter named Howard Vyse, who had taken possession of a farm house and farm sold by the Dominion Government to J. Hill. Constable Kerr had with him County Constable William Taylor, Special Officers Douglas Barr and Thomas Tyrrell. The officers commenced at once to cart Vyse's household furniture out of the house and on to the road. A number of Indian men and women gathered and soon took a hand in the affair.

Throw Stove Lids. They were friends of Vyse, apparently, and as often as the police threw Vyse's household effects over the fence on to the roadway the articles would come flying back again. Subsequently the Indians got rather worked up about this, and then the real trouble started.

The officers were deluged with an avalanche of stove lids, chairs, stones, and various other articles thrown by the Indians, and in the melee the police were forced to use their clubs to defend themselves. It was a regular "free-for-all." Among the combatants were many Indian women, who threw stones and other handy things at the visitors.

In the melee a team of horses which took the police out to Medina was taken away by the Indians, but soon afterwards recovered. As the battle became more strenuous the officers found themselves greatly outnumbered. They wielded their clubs with good effect, however, and gave as much as or more than they took. Finally more and more Indians kept arriving, and eventually the officers decided to leave the scene of the conflict and return with reinforcements.

Soldier Lost Farm. Speaking of the affair, High County Constable Kerr explained that trouble on the reserve had been brewing for some time past. Shortly after the war the Dominion Government had purchased several farms for returned Indian soldiers under the soldiers' civil re-establishment scheme. One of these, the Hill farm, was settled on by an overseas Indian, who failed to keep up his payments, and the farm was subsequently sold by the government.

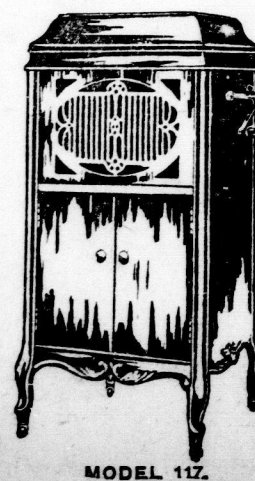

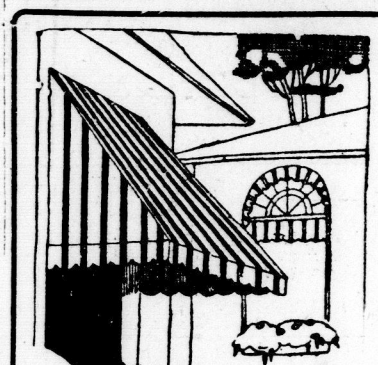
