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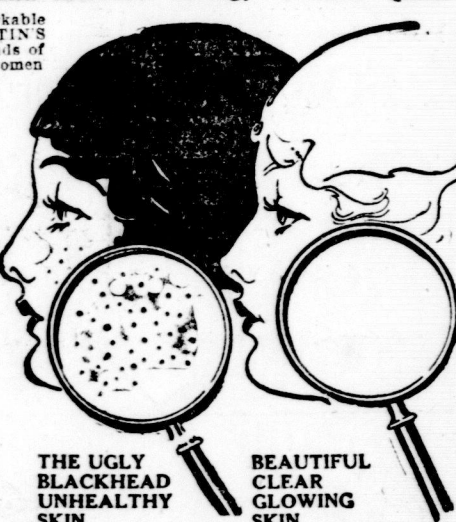

HOTELMEN ASK
PROVINCIAL AID

London Proprietors Offer Many Suggestions To Legislature Committee.

Will Take Moving Pictures of Port Stanley and Springbank.

Many suggestions for the betterment of hotel conditions, both in this city and the province, were received Wednesday afternoon by the parliamentary committee on hotel and tourist facilities, of the Provincial Legislature, now touring the province, from the hotel proprietors of London in a round table conference in the Tecumseh Hotel.

Some dozen hotel proprietors of the city met with the committee. Under consideration were suggestions of the cash bonusing of hotels, pool license monopolies, tax exemption, near beer monopolies, the sale of 4 per cent beer and others.

It was found that the proprietors were unanimous against the return of conditions as they were during the days of the open bar.

The suggestions the committee received in London, according to Chairman Edgar Watson, were similar to those of hotel proprietors elsewhere. Previous to the prohibition he stated a majority of hotel proprietors depended solely on the bar for their revenue, losing on the guests they put up.

It was the general opinion of the hotelmen that some provision should be made to assist the hotelkeeper, not so that he would have a greater net revenue, but that his surplus would enable him to make improvements on his establishment in order to accommodate the traveling public better.

Visit Springbank. Wednesday night the committee left at 4:20 to visit Springbank. Thursday morning the committee will leave at 6:30 a.m. for Chatham, going from there to Windsor.

It is expected that the committee will continue two months on its tour going into every part of Ontario with its investigations. The committee decided to take moving pictures of Springbank, Port Stanley and part of the Sarnia Gravel road in this district. Moving pictures of picturesque spots are being taken all over the province, and will be shown to the people in the United States. The pictures of Springbank, Port Stanley and the Sarnia Gravel road will be taken by the committee's cameraman next week.

Chairman Watson stated that facts and suggestions obtained by the committee in its tour will be carefully noted and compiled, and recommendation made to the Legislature. It is likely that a volume will be published for distribution through automobile clubs and hotels in both Canada and the United States, giving all information regarding roads, tourist camps, hotel accommodations and other facts. The hotelmen will probably be graded according to their standards of accommodation, and later steps may be taken to compel hotelmen who are not supplying adequate accommodation to either improve their places or lose their licenses. This, however, is a matter to be worked out later.

The committee arrived in London late Tuesday night and began its survey work in London Wednesday morning. The first activity of its members was a tour of the city as the guests of the London Motor Club. Accompanied by C. E. Bernard, the secretary of the Motor Club, the committee visited Thames Park, the crystal springs site, Springbank Park, Saunby flats on Ridout street and Queen's Park.

May Recommend Camp. Springbank Park found the most favor with the committee, and it is possible that if they recommend a summer camp for London they will also recommend that it be somewhere in this neighborhood. In the idea that London be chosen the members of the committee are influenced by the position of the city, it being the first city of large proportion that tourists from the Michigan border encounter.

At 12:30 the committee met the directors of the Chamber of Commerce, and the executive of the Motor Club at a banquet in the Tecumseh House. Present also were J. Franklin White, M.P., and Hugh Stevenson, M.L.A.

E. S. Little acted as chairman of the meeting and as president of the Chamber of Commerce welcomed the committee to London. Ald. Holmes welcomed the guests on behalf of the city.

Ald. Holmes welcomed the guests on behalf of the city. A London facilities for the accommodation of visitors and for the traveling public were entirely inadequate, said Ald. Holmes.

Outlines Purposes. E. Watson, the chairman of the committee, outlined to the gathering the purposes of the investigation they were carrying on.

"There is a change in the methods of transportation today," he stated, in making general remarks on the survey. "Traffic is going from the railroads to the highways. It is significant that more people traveled on the highways of the United States last year in motor cars than on the railroads."

It is the intention, the speaker went on to state, of the Ontario Legislature to get suggestions from the survey with regard to hotel accommodation and make improvements by legislation. As for the tourists, the speaker showed statistics and spoke of revenue to be acquired from them.

It is probable that the government will establish a publicity bureau to bring tourists to Ontario, he said.

At the close he called for suggestions concerning hotel accommodations from the directors of the chamber and others present. The committee is composed of Edgar Watson, M.P.P., chairman; Samuel Clarke, M.P.P.; Col. W. H. Price, M.P.P.; Joseph Cridland, M.P.P.; Malcolm Lang, M.P.P.; W. S. Dingman, and W. A. Lane, secretary.

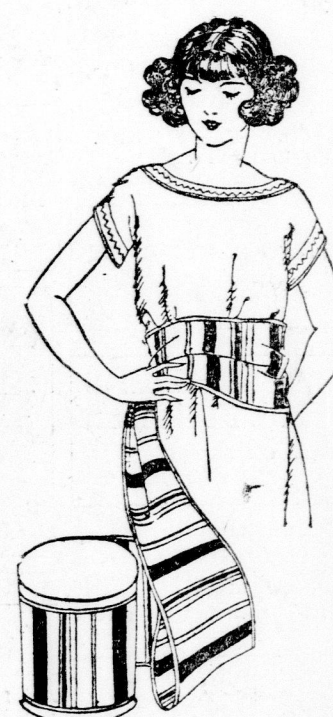

Prepare to Conduct Two Council Sessions at Provincial Camp.

A special compliment has been paid representatives of the Federation of Girls' Clubs of the London Y.W.C.A., who will attend the Industrial Business Girls' Summer Camp at Port Maitland, opening July 15, in asking them to take charge of two or three council sessions for the discussion of "standards."
