

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Oct. 30. -Richard J. Hopkins, state attorney-general, has been instructed to institute immediate action to expel every official of the Ku Klux Klan from the state of Kansas. The instructions came from Governor Henry J. Allen.

In a speech delivered Saturday night the governor denounced the Klan as a secret order operating without obeying the laws of the state by seeking a charter through the secretary of state, as other fraternal organizations have done.
