GLADSTONE TO THE PEOPLE.

THE GRAND OLD MAN APPEALS TO HIS CONSTITUENTS. Ireland Never So Loyal to the Crown, He Says.—The Country Calm and Peaceful.—He Dubs the Liberal Unionists "Dis-sentient Ex-Liberals"—Calms Reason Why Bring Ulster Back to Its Sense.

LONDON, June 24.—Mr Gladstone sent to-day his election manifesto in the form of an address to the electors of Midlothian. It is undoubtedly the ablest political paper that has come from the old man's hand in many years.

Never so loyal to the Crown, Ireland was never so attached to Great Britain, never so united in herself, as in the years following 1782 when she enjoyed self-government and until concord was disturbed after 1796 by the wicked machinations and intrigues of enemies.

In the history of this island in recent years that the people of Great Britain recognized the irresistible claim which Ireland made upon her sympathies. Calm reason would soon bring Ulster back to its senses and to brotherhood with the rest of Ireland—the brotherhood which existed before the union.

Dis-sentient Ex-Liberals. Mr Gladstone then criticizes recent English legislation and attempts at legislation on the part of the Government, incidentally describing Liberal Unionists as "Dis-sentient Ex-Liberals." He admits the importance of the labor question in the present time.

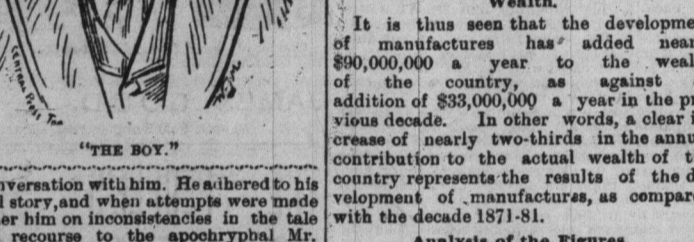

OTTAWA, June 24.—Canada's bulletin 10, relating to manufactures, was issued to-day. It shows that the total number of industrial establishments in the Dominion in 1891 was 75,769, an increase of 25,845, or 34 per cent, over 1881.

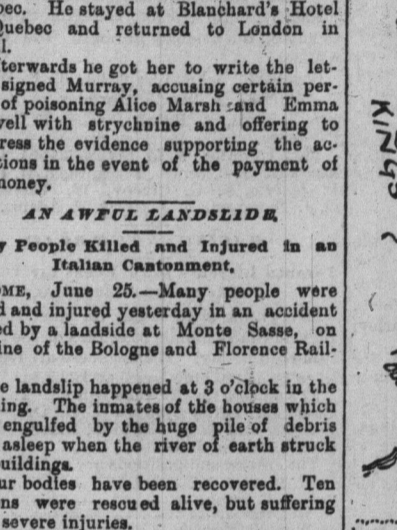
