MAP OF THE WORLD. On Prof. Penck's Scale Discussed at the Geographical Congress.

London, July 30.—The sixth annual International Geographical Congress opened its fourth day's session in the great hall of the Imperial Institute at 10 o'clock this morning. The chief subject of discussion were the reports upon Prof. Penck's proposed map of the world on the scale of 1:10,000,000. The most desirable that the metrical system was the report of the committee appointed at Berne, and the report of MM. Fabry and Leotaud for the Geographical Society of France.

The French delegates called attention to the fact that England's road to an inch measurement was a great hindrance to the adoption of Prof. Penck's plan, and urged that it was most desirable that the metrical system should be generally adopted. The discussion was carried on in the English, French and German languages.

Dr. W. Libby, Jr., of New York, read a paper on "The Relations of the Gulf Stream and the Labrador Current." The Prince of Monaco, who is now conducting researches in the Atlantic Ocean on board his steam yacht Princess Alice, sent a paper recounting the results of his previous scientific cruises, which was read.

THE SEIZURE OF TRINIDAD.

Port-au-Prince had intended to present the island to the U.S. The Chronicle claims to have authority to deny the statement that Great Britain has abandoned her occupation of the island of Trinidad.

New York, July 30.—The Herald's special from Buenos Ayres says: Rio Janeiro advises state that indignation meetings in protest against the seizure of Trinidad by England continue. These are not confined to Rio Janeiro, but are being held in all parts of the country.

TIN PLATE AT ROCK-HOT-SPONG.

American Competition Alleged to be Affecting the Trade in Wales. Washington, July 30.—Consul Howells, at Cardiff, in a report to the Department of State on the tin-plate trade of South Wales, says it is emerging from a crisis which reached an acute stage on the 1st of July, when 25 days' notice to terminate contracts on the part of the workmen expired, and work was consequently suspended in nearly all the mills. The men demanded a restoration of the wages of 1874. For months the great deal of tin-plate was experienced by both masters and men because of American competition, to which the fall in prices and the consequent reduction of wages and the stoppage of a large number of mills were attributed. The representatives of labor claimed that it was ridiculous to impoverish everybody interested in the trade.

"The lesson," Mr. Howells says, "has evidently been taken deeply to heart, that it was wiser than useless to attempt to prevent American competition and whatever effect the restoration of the 1874 list may have upon the demand for tin-plate, it must necessarily produce an improvement in prices, and in the interests of the immense number of operatives who have at times been brought to the verge of starvation it is to be hoped that the list will remain in operation for many years."

Continuing, he says that the price current is believed to be at its lowest ebb, the latest figures being \$17.50 per ton.
