Aeroplane Incidents on the Earth

A medical officer, who saw one of our aeroplanes shot down behind our lines, ran to render assistance; the German artillery was firing heavily in order to destroy the machine, and a splinter wounded this officer in the head; nevertheless he got to the wounded airman, dressed his wounds and got him back safely to the dressing station.

Save the Rags

A serious shortage in wool exists. Almost all countries engaged in the war have taken over the wool supply to provide for soldiers' equipment, while the United States Council of National Defense recently took up with the clothing manufacturers the matter of the saving of cloth by eliminating from the 1918 styles patch pockets, flaring skirts, cuffs on coats and trousers. etc., and all unnecessary pleats and frills. The council is also advocating the more general mixing of cotton with wool

and the more extended use of shoddy. For this reason the old fashioned rag-bag should come into fashion. The day when rags were not of sufficient value to warrant much attention being paid to them is past. Today there is a heavy demand for woolen rags. Scarcity of new wool has created an increased market for shoddy materials, of which woolen rags are the basis, and increased prices are being paid for this hitherto neglected material. Save the rags.

Few people trouble themselves about the reason that creamery butter is to be preferred to dairy butter, but by way of introduction to Bulletin No. 53 of the Dairy and Cold Storage Branch, Ottawa, Dairy Commissioner Ruddick furnishes an explanation. Incidentally he also points out that a good deal of damage is done to the trade by inferior dairy butter. The bulletin, for which Mr. George H. Barr, Chief of the Dairy Division, is responsible, in concise terms describes the whole process of buttermaking, tells the utensils that should be used and how they, should be used, gives the results of experiments with the separator as regards temperature and variations in speed, deals with the care of cream in cooling and preparing for churning shot through the throat, he pressed and in pasteurizing gives expert on and himself killed some of the counsel as to salting and working and points to the advisability of attractive packing in parchment paper. He also points out the requirements of the law in branding or marking and supplies practical hints on care of the utensils. Finally, he tells in terse terms how to get the best results in farm dairy work. Both the bulletin and a blue print of the plan for a dairy that is given can be had free by application to the Dairy Commissioner or to the Publications Branch, Department of Agriculture, Ottawa.
