had been transmitted to them for perusal and examination, and that thoy had carefully examined tho same.
The Committee then procecded to coneider tho Fiegulations and Prizo List in detail.
The remainder of the day was spent in this work.

## Present-same members.

The Committes resumad consideration of the Prize List and Regulations, with the following results:-

Rule 6. It will be necessary to revort to the original rording of this Rule, instead of adopting the change mate in pencil, wherely refereuce is required to numbers of the Nova Scotia Register,otherwise animals registered in standard Hend lbooks would be excluded from competition.

Rule 11. To this Rule, providing that live stock must have been owned and kept in the Province by the exhibitor not less than three monthe imme. diotely prior to the exhibition,-the Committee recommend the addition of the words: "except in case of animals imported to remain for breeding purposes in the Province."

The Executivo Committec of the Board consider it necessary to require the Exhibition Commistea to make the following changes upon the llize List, consisting principally of additions, viz:

Prizes haing offered for "County Collections" of Apples from all the soveral Counties of the Province, with exception of Hants; Annapolis änd King's, it does not appear to the Committee of the Board that there is any sufficient reason for making exception in the caso of these countios, and it will, therefore, be neceseary to add prizés for collections of Apples from Hants, Annapolis and Kings - sininilar to thiose offored to other counties.

It is also recommended that ayrize should be offered for the best barrel of Apples packed for the Euglish market.

It is thought that a better competition, better plants, and better general display; would be secured by limiting the number of pot Plants shown in a collection to twelve, or preferably ninc, instead of requiring " not less than twenty-five."

Moved by Colonel W': E. 'Starratt, seconided by Hon. Mr. LeBlanc, and Rcsolved :
"Haring examined carefully, in detail, the Prizo List prepared by the Exhibition Committee of King's County, and having considered fully how far'the List is likely to meei the views of competitors throughout the Province, in the several classes of exhibits, and thus to secure a successful Exhibition, aatisfaciors to tho Legisleture and the general public,we are of opinion that the aduitions and alterations above guggested should be incorporated into the l'rize List before it can be approved of by the Board and presented for sanction to His Honor the Lieut-Governor in Council. The Secretary of the Board is accordingly directed to return the Prize List to tho Secretary of the Exhibition Committce for this purpose. As it may be reasonally anticipated that not more than two-thinds or threc-fourths of the total prize money offered sioll be actually taken up, the Board Committee would strongly recommend the Exhibition Committee to adlopt their suggestions fully, vithoul material change. But, should the Exhibition Committee have sufficient renson to bo apprehensive of financial difficulty in attempting to carry out thic Exhibition on this basis, then the Board Committee would suggest, as the only apparent means of rendering possible the proportionato increase recommended in certain classes, that a uniform reduction of atout ten per cent be mado upon the whiole of the prizes in all Classes of "the Prize List,-or as near to ten per cenit in the several cases as can be reached withont introducing too maṇy fractional sunix's
