Practical Lumbering in New Ontario.

S most of us know, the northern and more westerly parts of Ontario are densely covered with pine forests from which is manufactured some of our very finest lumber. In the fall of the year the lumber companies who have purchased these limits of pine send in gangs of men under the super-

vision of foremen, to wage a war against nature and destroy some of her most beautiful handiwork. And she does not concede without a protest as very often men are killed or maimed

for life in this interesting though somewhat dangerous occupation. The lumberjack must always be on the lookout, while at his work, for falling trees.

When the men arrive at the scene of operations, the first thing to be done is to construct camps, and stables. These are built of logs, layed one on top of the other and dovetailed together at the ends, the chinks being filled in with moss and mortar. The roofs
