
"THE Treatment of Diarrhoea in Infants and Adults," by Robert Kenner, A.M., M.D., Chicago Ill., for New Albany Medical Journal, New Albany, Ind.:

There is possibly no disorder more common than diarrha a. The remedies for this affliction, too, are very numerous, and comprise the most diverse methods of treatment. the purpose of this article to deal with the principles of the correct treatment of this disorder, and suggest such remedies as have in my hands been productive of good results.

Mrs. J. S. S., age 31, was taken with a diarrhœa in the middle of the night, and had suffered with an active cathorsis for more than three She was given a dose of sulphate of magnesium, and told after her bowels had acted freely-and she had had a watery action, characteristic action of the magnesium-she was to begin taking Concentrated Extract of White Oak Bark (S. H. Kennedy's). The first dose of the Oak was taken at 4 p.m. The next morning she had no diarrhœa, and has since gotten on well.

S. L. G., age 14 months. child was taken ill of a profuse diarrhæa. She showed evidence of much exhaustion. She was allowed only a diet of sterilized milk, and was put on Concentrated Extract of White Oak Bark (S. H. Kennedy's) every two hours.
