

3. (a) It is understood that this Agreement does not exempt Canadian and Finnish citizens coming respectively to Finland and to Canada from the necessity of complying with the laws and regulations of the country concerned regarding the entry, residence (temporary or permanent) and employment or occupation of foreigners and that persons who are unable to satisfy the Immigration authorities that they comply with these laws and regulations are liable to be refused leave to enter or Land.
- (b) In those cases where visas, residence and labour permits are still required, they will be issued free of charge.

If the Government of Canada is prepared to accept the foregoing provisions, I have the honour to suggest that this Note and your reply thereto shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments which shall take effect from January 1, 1959 and that this Agreement shall revoke the Agreement between our two Governments concluded by an Exchange of Notes, dated December 19, 1955, and January 9, 1956*, for the waiving of visa fees.
