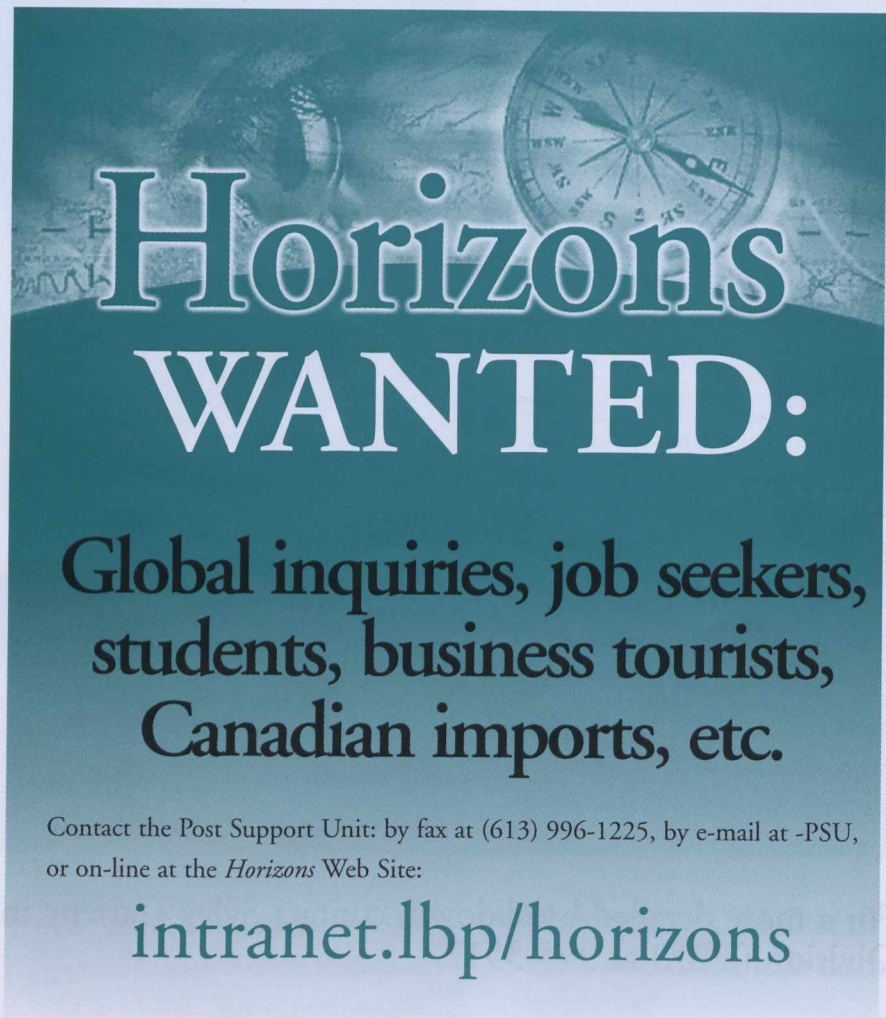
Posts can now report major trade barriers through a database available on the Internet.

The Trade and Investment Barriers Database is:

- accessible with password and user name
- a venue for officers to report and track major market access barriers
- capable of classifying information by different subjects
- one way to alert HQ to problems that may need to be addressed in future bilateral negotiations

To access the database, register on-line (see the Horizons Web site under *Services to Businesses>>Troubleshooting*). Within 24 hours, you will receive a user name, password and instructions by e-mail.
