- 3. In which department is each such position available and in what division or branch?
- 4. Have any of the positions been filled and, if so, in each case (a) in which department is the position located (b) what is the salary of the person hired (c) was the winning competitor a public servant in the position that he or she held immediately prior to winning the competition (d) what was his or her salary?—Sessional Paper No. 301-2/2,462.
