

10. (1) The Governor in Council may appoint nine persons to be members of a Pension Tribunal, one of such persons shall be appointed chairman of the tribunal and be and each of the other members thereof shall hold office for ten years subject only to earlier removal for cause.

Pension Tribunal

(2) The salary of the chairman of the Pension Tribunal shall be seven thousand dollars a year and the salary of each of the other members thereof shall be six thousand dollars a year.

Salaries

11. (1) The Governor in Council may appoint three persons to be members of a Pension Appeal Court; one of such persons shall be appointed president thereof and be and each of the other members thereof shall hold office for ten years subject only to earlier removal for cause.

Pension Appeal Court

(2) The salary of the president of the Pension Appeal Court shall be eight thousand dollars a year and the salary of each of the other members thereof shall be seven thousand dollars a year.

Salaries

12. Each member of the Pension Tribunal and each member of the Pension Appeal Court shall devote his whole time to the performance of the duties of his office and shall not hold any other office or employment.

Whole-time and no other office

13. All the members of the Pension Appeal Court and the chairman of the Pension Tribunal shall reside at Ottawa or within ten miles thereof and each of the other members of the Pension Tribunal shall reside at such place as may be directed by the chairman.

Residence

14. Notwithstanding anything in this Act contained, no member of the Pension Tribunal or of the Pension Appeal Court shall continue in office after he has attained the age of seventy years unless it is declared by the Governor in Council, either before or within one month after the termination of such member's term of office, that it is in the public interest that he should remain in office for an additional period of twelve months, but no such member shall continue his continuance in office if any such member after he has attained the age of seventy-five years.

Continuation in office

15. (1) The Governor in Council upon the recommendation of any member of the Commission or of the Pension Tribunal or the Pension Appeal Court who has served upon one or other of such bodies during at least twenty years in who has so served during at least ten years and not reached the age of seventy years or is physically or mentally incapacitated, may grant to him a pension for his life not exceeding one-third of the salary to which he was entitled as such member.
