Information about the distribution of older persons by size of their earnings (i.e. wages and salaries and net income from self-employment) is limited to those non-farm individuals who were labour force participants at the time of the 1961 Census and excludes approximately 20,000-25,000 individuals aged 70 and over, who had received some earned income during the past twelve months but had left the labour force by June 1, 1961. No statistics are available on the distribution of these individuals by the size of their earned income.
