## Question No. 3,507—Mr. Forrestall:

1. What was the amount of payments made to truckers under the Atlantic Region Freight Assistance Act for the fiscal year 1974-75 on traffic moving (a) within the region (b) westbound out of the region (c) under the Selective Assistance Plan?
2. What companies are the fifteen principal recipients of the reimbursements for freight carried within the Atlantic Region on freight originating and destined within the area and of these how many are in the category of common carriers?
3. What companies are in the first fifteen on traffic carried westbound?
4. How many carrying freight westbound would be in the category of common carriers, such as, carriers offering to transport the goods of all shippers for compensation as distinct from truckers carrying the goods of a particular industry or industries under contract?
